



## Main works

Main works are the activities on campus associated with the main works contract. Main works for the RPA Hospital redevelopment include the 15-storey tower and building extensions, refurbishment of existing spaces, and the landscaping and associated road and external works.

### Main works contractor awarded

The new \$940 million Royal Prince Alfred Hospital redevelopment is on track to deliver first-class health services with the appointment of the main works contractor CPB Contractors.

CPB Contractors has developed a strong reputation for its expertise in delivering successful projects including the redevelopment of Campbelltown and Nepean hospitals. Their expert team will draw on their considerable experience for their design and planning role at RPA.

This is the most significant investment in RPA's 140-year history to support the world-leading services provided at RPA for the 740,000 people who live in Sydney Local Health District and the more than 1 million people who come into the District each day to work, study and visit.

Construction on the RPA Hospital redevelopment is expected to be completed in 2028 and will include:



Expanded and enhanced Emergency Department and Intensive Care Units



Expanded neonatology services



State-of-the-art operating theatres



Improved roads, signage and landscaping throughout the hospital campus



Expanded and improved adult inpatient ward accommodation



A new open garden courtyard



Increased interventional and imaging services

It is estimated that the \$940 million RPA Hospital redevelopment will support approximately 1700 direct jobs, with the potential for supporting thousands of indirect jobs over the life of the project.

Early works are already under way on site to prepare the campus for main construction, which includes the temporary relocation of the helicopter landing site to the roof of a multi-storey car park located off Hospital Road and Grose Street, on RPA's western campus.

## Timing of work

Main works will be completed across the campus in stages to minimise disruption and ensure clinical services remain operational during construction.

There will also be increased interventional and imaging services and improved roads, signage and landscaping, including the new northern arrival on Johns Hopkins Road.

## Next stage of works

Once main works commence the entrance to the hospital building from Johns Hopkins Drive will be temporarily adjusted as part of the reimagined northern entrance and landscaping.

These works will involve changes to the way staff, patients and visitors access key departments and services. We will continue to provide information around these impacts as they progress.

Working on complex construction builds in high-density areas requires meticulous planning, precise execution, and unwavering attention to detail. The RPA redevelopment demands innovative solutions, collaborative partnerships, and a deep understanding of urban dynamics.
