Works notice: Lambie Dew Drive tree removal

From 7am on Monday 4 March 2024 there will be tree removal works taking place inside the construction site on Lambie Dew Drive near the boundary of RPA Hospital campus and Sydney University.


There is no pedestrian access on Lambie Dew Drive and the best access between RPA Hospital and Sydney University is via Johns Hopkins Drive.

Works have commenced to protect the trees located outside the construction site near the Sydney University oval. The construction activities may produce some noise and dust.

A traffic control plan has been developed and there will be traffic controllers in place for the duration of works to help pedestrians and vehicles navigate the space.

Key impacts

- Tree removal and tree protection works on Lambie Dew Drive
- Pedestrian access changes
- Dedicated traffic controllers in place to assist you to safely navigate the space
- Increase of construction works and traffic in this area



Landscaping works

A replanting strategy has been developed for the RPA Redevelopment which includes the planting of new trees within the project area. The landscaping plan includes flora that is indigenous to the local area. Learn more in our Landscape Fact Sheet.

Pedestrian access changes

The future 15-storey hospital building will be located on Lambie Dew Drive. For the duration of the redevelopment, there is no pedestrian access on Lambie Dew Drive. Pedestrian access between RPA Hospital campus and Sydney University is via the footpath on Johns Hopkins Drive.
