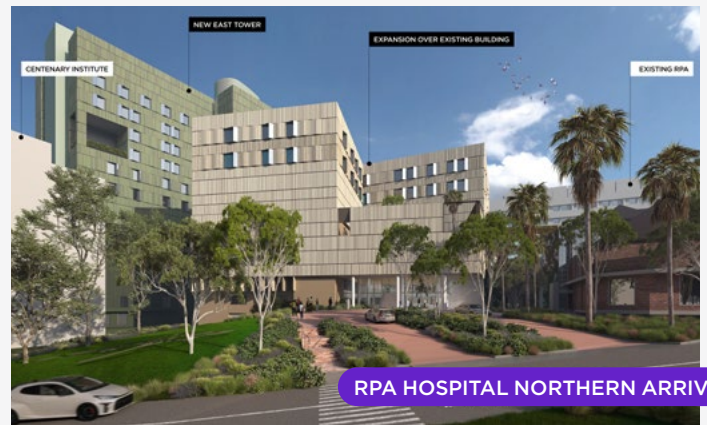


The NSW Government has committed \$750 million to the redevelopment of Royal Prince Alfred (RPA) Hospital to deliver a new hospital building and refurbishment of existing spaces.

This is the most significant investment in RPA's 140-year history to support the world-leading services provided at RPA for the 740,000 people who live in Sydney Local Health District and the more than 1 million people who come into the District each day to work, study and visit.

When complete, the RPA Redevelopment will deliver:

- Expanded and enhanced Emergency Department and Intensive Care Units
- State-of-the-art operating theatres
- Expanded and improved adult inpatient accommodation
- Increased interventional and imaging services
- Expanded neonatology services
- Facilities and capabilities for integrated research, education and training
- Improved public domain and services including roads, wayfinding, landscaping and information and communications technology infrastructure.



Public Exhibition Period

The RPA Hospital redevelopment will be assessed and approved under the State Significant Development Application (SSDA) process. The planning applications for the RPA Hospital Redevelopment is on public exhibition until 1 March 2023.

Alterations and additions to the RPA Hospital East Campus include:

- Fifteen (15) storey eastern wing with clinical space for inpatient units, medical imaging, delivery, neonatal and women's health services, connecting to the existing hospital building
- A helicopter landing site on top of the eastern wing
- Eastern extension with a three storey extension to the east of the existing clinical services building to accommodate new operating theatres and plant areas
- Internal refurbishment of existing services building including emergency department and imaging
- Enhanced northern entry with improved pedestrian access and public amenity
- Demolition of buildings, structures and trees
- Changes to internal road alignments and paving treatments
- Landscaping works

Works to the RPA Hospital West Campus include:

- Temporary helipad landing site above existing multi-storey carpark
- Relocations and upgrades of services (eg. gas and electrical)
