Information sheet: Tower crane installation Lambie Dew Drive and Johns Hopkins Drive

We are planning to install a tower crane in early January as part of the RPA Redevelopment works. It is expected that from 1am Saturday 18 January to 12am Monday 20 January 2025 works will occur on Lambie Dew Drive and Johns Hopkins Drive.

There will be out of hours activity to ensure the safe installation of the tower crane in a timely manner. There may be some associated noise during the delivery and set-up of the mobile crane between 1am to 6am on Saturday 18 January 2025.

There will be a full road closure of Johns Hopkins Drive as there will be a large number of semi-trailer deliveries accessing the site via Johns Hopkins Drive.

There will be detours during deliveries and there is a traffic control plan in place to help people navigate the space. People are advised to always follow the direction of traffic controllers and signage.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, however people may be stopped during key crane movements to ensure everyone's safety.

Works may be rescheduled, and we will continue to keep stakeholders informed of any changes as they occur.

Loading dock access

RPA Hospital loading dock access will be via Gloucester House Drive only and there will be no through road to Johns Hopkins Drive. There will be no public vehicle access to Johns Hopkins Drive.

Key impacts

- Out of hours activity to install tower crane on Lambie Dew Drive
- Regular semi-trailer deliveries to Lambie Dew Drive on RPA Hospital east campus
- Increase of construction traffic in surrounding area
- Road closed on Johns Hopkins Drive with access granted for key personnel
- All access to RPA Hospital loading dock via Gloucester House Drive only

Construction delivery route

There will be an increase of construction vehicles and semi-trailers using the nearby public roads to deliver equipment and parts for the crane installation.

Semi-trailers will access the site by turning right on Missenden Road from King Street. The semi-trailer will perform a three-point turn on Missenden Road and be reversed down Johns Hopkins Drive to the construction site located on Lambie Dew Drive.

To exit the campus, semi-trailers will turn right on Missenden Road from Johns Hopkins Drive and head towards Parramatta Road.

Pedestrian, cyclist and vehicle access

The pedestrian footpath between RPA Hospital campus and the University of Sydney will remain open and accessible. Cyclists are reminded to avoid using Johns Hopkins Drive and Gloucester House Drive to access the University of Sydney campus.

Best access to the University of Sydney and Charles Perkins Centre for cyclists is via Carillon Avenue and via Parramatta Road for vehicles. Always follow direction from traffic controllers and take care when navigating around construction.

Risks and controls

- Traffic controllers in place to support safe navigation around works and provide access to key personnel.
- Pedestrian access maintained under the guidance of traffic controllers.
- Approved lift plan and methodology.
- Authority approval for oversized deliveries via public roads
